### British and Foreign.

(To the St. John Associated Press.)

London, March 25.

In the Commons Lowe submitted his annual budget.

It shows an estimated expenditure last year of £72,736,000 while the actual expenditure was £71,730,000, estimated receipts were £72,351,000, actual receipts £75,535,000, giving a surplus of £2,920,000.

The speech in which Lowe presented the details of the budget was favorably received and greeted with cheers at the close.

He recommended that duties on coffee and chicory be reduced 50 per cent, and two pence on the pound be taken off income tax; but these reductions, he admitted, would oblige him to lower his estimate of total revenue.

He closed with a motion for the immediate reduction of the duties on coffee and chicory.

The Marquis of Lansdowne will probably succeed Lord Northbrook as Under Secretary of War.

Last Protestant chapel in Madrid is closed.

250 Toronto master printers, with one exception, refused the terms proposed by the Typographical Union, and the men are on the strike. The employers are determined to resist, and the strikers are equally resolved to insist on an increase of wages. Newspapers will appear as usual.

The Government forces in Mexico, 2nd inst., defeated the rebels, killing and wounding 700, capturing 7,000, and all their artillery except 5 guns.
