

REPORT OF THE SUB-COMMITTEE OF CHARITY

TO THE
COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT
FOR THE YEAR 1895.

The Sub-Committee of Charity again beg to submit their Statement of expenditure for the past year. The whole amount disbursed has been \$427.85, including the usual Christmas dinners, the following being the payments in detail :—

In all we have relieved 173 cases, comprising over 200 persons, men women and children.

Messrs. Doyle, Immigration Agent, and Myrand, of the Richelieu Company, have again assisted us, and we beg them to accept our best thanks.

There has passed away during the year one who was always willing and ready to assist the Society in alleviating the wants of the poor of this city ; we refer to the late Miss Latimer. In recording her death we believe we are only doing justice to the memory of one who was highly esteemed by all classes and creeds.
