Cape Jack, a settlement in Antigonish Co., on St. George's Bay, 26 miles from Antigonish, fare \$1, pop. 220.

Cape John, a headland of Nova Scotia, on Northumberland Strait, lat. 45 deg. 40 N., lon. 64 deg. 10 W.

Cape John (sub. elec. dis.), a post village on the above headland in Pictou Co., 15 miles from Pictou, fare 50 cts., it contains 1 store, 2 saw mills, pop. 1830.

Cape Mabou.—See Mabou Cape.

Cape Negro, a post village in Shelburne Co., 7 miles from Barrington. There is a lighthouse on a small island opposite the Cape; pop 385.

Cape Negro Island, a light station at the entrance to Cape Negro Harbor, Shelburne Co., twelve miles from Barrington, fare 50 cts., pop 165.

Cape North, the N. E. extremity of the island of Cape Breton; lat. 47 deg. 2 N., lon. 64 deg. 5 W.

Cape North (sub. elec. dis.), a post settlement on the above Cape in Victoria Co., 35 miles from Ingonish, fare \$1.50. The submarine cable from Newfoundland is landed in Aspey.
