

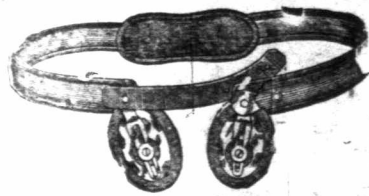

SYRIAN SITUATION
IS STILL CRITICAL

The Country Surrounding Damas-
cus Seething With
Revolt.

London, Oct. 31.—A despatch to the Evening News from Haifa, Pal-
estine, says the situation in Damas-
cus, where the French recently put
down an insurrection upstart, is still
critical, while the surrounding coun-
try is "seething."

The French authorities are said to
be imposing heavy fines on the city.
Owing to the Damascus insurgents
failure to deliver rifles in accordance
with the terms laid down by the
French, a fine of £10,000 was imposed
on Monday.

Of the 3,000 rifles demanded only
1,685 were delivered, and further
fines of £500 must be paid each day
until the last rifle is handed in, the
correspondent reports.

The French guaranteed there
would be no further bombardments,
but barbed wire barriers have been
erected in the streets to prevent an-
ambushes. The city is reported quiet,
but with strong revolutionary under-
currents. The country to the north,
the despatch says, is in a state of
complete revolution. The telephone
lines have been cut. Motor cars are
held up within three miles of the
city and the passengers robbed.
Strong bands of Damascuses are
attacking the villages in revenge for
the failure of their inhabitants to
join in the frings against the French.

News Briefs From Over Continent

Port Haney, B. C., Oct. 31.—Alfred
Portman of Langley Prairie was in-
stantly killed here yesterday when
the smokestack of a loco fell on his
head and fractured his skull.

Barber Made a Mistake.

Chicago, Oct. 31.—Mr. and Mrs.
Carrie Guthaus had their hair cut and
bobbed respectively in the same bar-
ber shop. But the barber made the
mistake of giving Mrs. Guthaus a
letter addressed to her husband and
containing the words "if you cared for
me as I for you, you would not let
an hour pass without calling me up."
Mrs. Guthaus promptly filed suit for
fifty thousand dollars against the
alleged writer.

Rainbow Tiles in Bath Rooms.

Washington, Oct. 31.—Only the very
wealthy should have rainbow tiles in
their bath-rooms, Roy Jordan told the
manufacturers association. Any
house worth under ten thousand dol-
lars should have a little white bath-
room; pink or blue tile at a cost of

twenty thousand dollars but only in
a house worth more than forty thou-
sand dollars should purple, yellow and
green tiles greet the eye.

New York, Oct. 31.—Holdups and
burglaries have been so frequent in
New York that the Aetna Insurance
Company has ordered its agents to
decrease their risk on silk, jewelry,
fur, clothing and payroll protection.

PROHIBITION IN
THE UNITED STATES
Federal Council of Churches
Pledges Its Unequivocal
Support.

Washington, Oct. 31.—"Prohibition
has already yielded results which
fully justify its adoption."

This is the flat statement of the
administrative committee of the Fed-
eral Council of Churches after con-
sidering its policy on the subject in
the light of the recent report on the
prohibition situation issued by its re-
search department.

There is nothing in the report, the
administrative committee say, "to
justify modification of the stand of
the churches for prohibition."

The council renews in the state-
ment its pledge of unequivocal sup-
port of national prohibition in the
United States.

The statement urges the friends of
prohibition in other countries not to
be deceived by various attempts to
interpret the research report as a
confession of failure or even discou-
agement, and calls upon churches to
undertake a new moral crusade to
strengthen the hands of those who
are responsible for prohibition
enforcement.

STEAMER AGROUND.

Eagle Harbor, Mich., Oct. 31.—The
steamer Charles L. Hatchinson,
which went aground on Manitou
Island last night during a raging
Lake Superior gale, was reported to
be breaking up to-day. A coast
guard crew of seven men who left
there, despite the storm, had not been
heard from. In a 35 foot life boat
they faced a 35 mile battle with a
high sea and terrific wind. It is not
known here how many men are
aboard the stricken vessel.
