Seymbur, Hon. Benjamin. C.

Only s. of an English gentleman, who settled in the township of Fredericksburg, united counties of Lennox and Addington, Ont., about the year 1793, and who was twice a candidate for the representation of the said counties in parliament, but defeated by small majorities. B. in Fredericksburg, 1806. Ed. at the Royal Grammar School, Kingston. M. in 1833, a dau of the late Duncan McKenzie, Esq. Sat for Lennox and Addington in Leg. Assembly, Can. from 1844 to 1854. Was a Life mem. of the Leg. Council, Can., from 1855 until the Union. Called to the Senate by Royal Proclamation May, 1867.—Seymour Place, Port Hope, Ont.

B. in Co. Wexford, Irel. Emigrated to Can., 1820. Sat in Leg. Assembly, Can., for
