N° 2 Extract of a Letter from Lieut. Governor Wentworth to Mr. Secretary Dundas; dated Halifax, 22d March 1793.

I AM deeply penetrated with the most grateful Sentiments, for the Confideration His Majesty's Servants have been pleased to take on my Proposal for raising a Provincial Regiment, which I can complete in a very short Time, with able Men. mostly used to Service, and would be a great and most useful Addition of Force to His Majesty's Service; more particularly in Cases of Emergency, or inimical Attempts on these Provinces, wherein, from their Knowledge of the Country, their Habits of Travelling and Hardship, they might be of singular Utility.
