Rev Sir,

I, beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 17th Instant, and to may that your explanations regarding the Reserves in your County, appear to be very class.

The Department does not, at present, see its way to entertain a proposal to enlarge any of them;

It would appear advisable to encourage the Indiana to clear up and bring under cultivation, as great in area of their Reserves as possible. The more stony and rough portion might remain as woodlands, which would always be valuable to the Indians for firewood.
