Mr. MacInnes, -

Please prepare memorandum to Council approving of the two surrenders hereunder, given recently by the members of the White Bear Reserve, in the Province of Saskatchewan, and covering lands which it is proposed to lease for summer resort purposes to the Town of Carlyle. For one parcel it has been agreed that the Town of Carlyle wilk pay to the White Bear Band the sum of \$500.00 in cash, and an annual rental of \$400.00 for a period of twenty-five, years, and in addition, during the last twenty years of this period, ten per cent. of the gross rentals received by the municipality. For the second parcel the Town of Carlyle has agreed to pay the Band an annual rental of \$400.00 and a similar participation in the gross rentals during the last twenty years of the lease. Both these surrenders have been approved by a majority of the voting members of the White Bear Band.
