Sir,-

At the request of Mr. Iver Fougner, Indian Agent at Bella Coola, the Department has decided to have printed 500 copies of a poster giving warning of the prohibition of the sale of liquor to Indians--250 of the posters to be in Japanese and the same number in Chinese--to be posted up on salmon canneries by Indian agents. The order for this printing has been sent to the Canadian News in your city, by the King's Printer, and request will now be made that the supply of these posters be delivered to you, and I have, therefore, to ask that on receipt of the same you will be good enough to send some to Agent Fougner and divide the remainder between other Indian agents within whose agencies there are Chinese or Japanese residing.
