



Ottawa, Aug. 24, 1914.

Gentlemen:-

Referring to your letter of the 14th instant, addressed to the Department of the Interior and which has been transferred to this Department, I beg to inform you that the petition from a number of Indians to have the flood wood jam, in the Carrot River, removed, was forwarded by Mr. S. J. Jackson, Inspector of Indian Agencies, to the Department of Public Works. If any action is taken towards removing the jam it should be done by that Department. It may be presumed that any work of this kind will not be done until a proper examination has been made by a competent engineer. Your letter has been transferred to the Department of Public Works.
