Ottawa, 4th May, 1915.

Circular

Sir:-

When flour is delivered at your Agency under contract the Department desires to receive from you a one pound sample of the delivery, in order that it may be compared by an Expert with the standard sample. You should enclose the sample in a bag of linen, or other strong material, fastened in such manner that it may be easily opened, so as to enable the officers of the post office to satisfy themselves as to the nature of the contents. If not more than one pound is transmitted twelve cents will cover the postage charges, but you should be particular to put on the parcel a sufficient number of stamps to ensure safe delivery. No war stamps are required. You should mark the name of your Agency very clearly on the bag, or on a tag attached thereto. The sample will be useless when received if it does not bear the name of the Agency.
