

south boundary thirty chains; thence north thirty-five chains, thence east thirty-two chains more or less to the shore; thence northerly and westerly along the said shore to the point of commencement; the said described tract of land is bordered red on the blue print plan hereto attached.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto His said Majesty The King, his heirs and successors forever, in trust to sell the same to such person or persons, and upon such terms as the Government of the Dominion of Canada may deem most conducive to our welfare and that of our people.

AND upon the further condition that all moneys received from the sale thereof shall be placed to our credit and interest thereon paid to us in the usual way.

AND We, the said Chief and Principal men of the said the Chemainus Band of Indians do on behalf of our people and for ourselves, hereby ratify and confirm, and promise to ratify and confirm, whatever the said Government may do, or cause to be lawfully done, in connection with the sale of the said timber and the disposition of the moneys derived therefrom.
