MEN FOR DUTY, THE ORDER IN WHICH TO BE WARNED.

1. Guard.
2. Escort or command parties.
3. Pickets.
4. Company Cook.
5. Regimental fatigues detailed from orderly room.
6. Company fatigues, such as stairs and passage orderly, ration carrier, &c.
7. Orderly men of rooms or tents.

8. The Sergeant-Major in detailing fatigue parties will name those first which are liable to be first wanted. Thus, a party required at 7 a. m. will be given out before one wanted at or not required till 9 a. m.
