posts, stone, lumber, shingles, ties and tan-

on the Rideau Canal (which furnishes power)
in Oxford township, Grenville County, 28
miles north of Brockville, the county seat,
and 10 west of Kemptville, on the St L &
O Ry (C P Ry), its nearest railway station.
Nearest bank at Smith's Falls. Settled in
1795. It contains Episcopal and Methodist
churches, and common schools, and ships
grain and lumber. Stages daily to Merrick-
ville and Kemptville, fares 25c and 75c
respectively. Population, 300. Telegraph,
GNW. Mail daily. Thomas A Kidd, post-
master.
