BOOK (Captain) and KING'S, VOYAGES towards the SOUTH POLE and ROUND the WORLD, also a VOYAGE to the PACIFIC OCEAN, for the purpose of making discoveries in the Northern Hemisphere, *portrait and folding maps*, also the FOLIO ATLAS of PLATES, comprising *portraits of the natives, their customs, ceremonies, views of scenery, etc.*, by *Middiman, Bartolozzi, Byrne, Sharp, Sherman (who was a pupil of Bartolozzi)*, and others, together 5 vols, 4to and folio atlas, *appropriately and substantially rebound in half morocco*, 15.25, 1777-1784. 1

Mercator, Historia Mvndi, or MERCATOR'S ATLAS, containing his Cosmographical Description of the Fabricke and Figure of the World, lately rectified in divers places, as also beautified and enlarged with new Mappes and Tables, by the studious industry of *Lvdocus Hvndy*, Englished by W. S. [*Wye Saltonstall, a well known and diligent old geographer and antiquary.*] stout folio, half morocco, 15.50, for *Michael Sparke and S. Cartwright*, 1635. 3

Wants a leaf at page 894, descriptive of Hispaniola; and the ornamentation has been abstracted from the map of Cyprus. The preliminary as also the last leaves are a little worn. The volume contains 930 pages, and about 180 maps, the American portion with errata will be found at the end of the volume which has the Llandaff Coat of Arms.
