**Saint Paul's Island.** Bill relating to Light Houses and other establishments on the Island of Saint Paul's in the Gulph of Saint Lawrence.—Brought up and read first time 393; read second time 397; discharged from the order of the day 402; committed 405, reported *ib.*; further consideration postponed *ib.*

**Savings Bank.** Petition from the Trustees of the Saint John Savings Bank, praying that a grant may pass to indemnify certain Individuals from a voluntary obligation they entered into with the depositors in that Institution.—Presented and received 343.

**Seamen.** Bill to continue the Act of 7 G. 4, c. 12, for the regulation of Seamen.—Brought up 335; read first time 336; read second time 339; committed 341; reported *ib.*; read third time and passed *ib.*; Assembly acquainted thereof *ib.*; Lieutenant Governor's assent 445.

—2. Bill for facilitating the recovery of Wages of Seamen in the Merchant Service and Coasting Trade of this Province.—Brought up and read first time 392; read second time and referred to Select Committee 397; reported 404; committed 409; reported *ib.*; further consideration postponed *ib.*

—3. Bill to explain the Act in addition to and in amendment of the several Acts now in force to provide for sick and disabled Seamen not being paupers, so far as relates to Gloucester.—Brought up and read first time 405; read second time 408; committed 416; reported *ib.*; further consideration postponed *ib.*

**Simpson, Thomas.** Petition.—Presented and received 410.

**Slaves.** Bill to prevent the clandestine landing of liberated Slaves and other persons therein mentioned, from vessels arriving in the Province.—Brought up 425; read first time 426; read second time 429; committed 436; reported *ib.*; further consideration postponed *ib.*

**Small Debts.** Petition from the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the City of Saint John, praying that a Bill may pass for the more easy and speedy recovery of small debts and demands in the City of Saint John.—Presented and received 345.

—2. Bill for the more easy and speedy recovery of small Debts in the City of Saint John.—Brought up and read first time 407; read second time 412; further consideration postponed *ib.*

**Speaker and Members of Assembly.** Bill to provide for the expences of the Speaker and Members of the House of Assembly, while attending the General Assembly.—Brought up and read first time 353; read second time and further consideration postponed 366; Resolutions of Council on postponing consideration of this Bill *ib.*
