- To the Clerk of the House of Assembly, twenty one pounds one stilling and three pence, for fuel, stationary and other extra expenses of the last session.
- · To the Treasurer of the Province, one hundred and eighty oounds for his services as Treasurer from the 1st March 1792, to 1st March, 1793.
- 'To John Chaloner, Tide Surveyor in the city of Saint John, forty pounds for his services to the 1st March, 1793.
- · To John Chaloner for gauging Rum ten pounds and four fillings, and to Thomas Hanford for the same services forteen · pounds and fix pence.
- 'To Charles M'Pherson for weighing dutiable articles in the city of Saint John, eight pounds two shillings and eight pence.
- 'To Colin Campbell, Esquire, for his past services as Clerk of the Crown Office, fifty pounds.
- 'To Ward Chipman, Esquire, for his past services as Clerk of the Grown upon the Circuit, fifty pounds.
- To the Surveyor General the ballance of his account attending the completion of the plan of the province, fifty * pounds.
- To the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in King's county a sum expended by them in pursuance of a resolution of this House of the 7th March 1792, fifteen pounds.
- To John Ryan, Printer, for printing manifests and other blanks for the use of the Treasurer of the Province; and also for inferting certain advertisements for the same, nine pounds

* twelve shillings and fix pence.

- To the Commissioners of the Light House a ballance due to them as by account delivered, thirty one pounds one shilling and eleven pence.
- 'To Alexander Cameron and Company, for erecting a Maltkiln in the city of Saint John pursuant to a resolution of this
- House of the 24th October 1789, they first giving security
