Iron Mask and Centre Star Trial Tomorrow.

SOME EXPERT TESTIMONY

What the Case Will Cover—Details of the Pleadings—Some of the Experts—Most Important Mining Case Ever Tried in Canada.

The great legal battle between the Iron Mask Gold Mining Company and the Centre Star Corporation, George Gooderham and P. G. Blackstock, will commence this morning before the Hon. Mr. Justice Walkem without the assistance of a jury.

How far is a crown grant conclusive evidence of title? What is the result of recording a mineral claim?

No one imagines that the judgment of the court of the first instance, whatever it may be, will be accepted as final.

The story of the law suit between the Iron Mask Gold Mining Company (foreign), the Centre Star Mining & Milling Company (foreign), George Gooderham and Thomas Gibbs Blackstock, will be the original pleadings and the amendments made to date, shows that the suit was instituted on December 31, 1891.

At about three weeks ago the plaintiffs applied to amend and add to their statement of claim. Their application was allowed, and the opening of the case on Monday, another amendment was still further amended, was allowed upon terms.
