Sudden Death.

Mr. William Cook, aged 65 years, for a number of years a resident of this town, dropped dead at the road at Church St., on Thursday afternoon of last week, near the residence of Mr Howard West. Children of Mr Nealey saw a man lying in the road and informed Mr E. J. Armstrong, who lives near. Mr Armstrong investigated the matter and discovered that the man was dead. He at once notified the Coroner, Dr. Fallerton, who ordered the body removed. The remains were brought to Wolfville, to the home of his daughter, where on Friday afternoon an inquest was held by Coroner Fallerton. The jury was made up as follows: E. K. Harris (foreman), F. J. Porter, J. M. Shaw, C. M. Vaughan, J. L. Franklin, F. W. Woodman, L. W. Sloop, Wm. Regan, Thomas Foster, W. H. Dunsmuir, L. H. Baid, F. W. Eagles. Messrs West and Armstrong and the undertaker gave evidence, when a verdict was rendered that death was caused by heart disease. The funeral was held on Saturday afternoon, the remains being interred at Church St.

FARRAGE.—At Kingsport, on March 19th, Mrs Ruben Farrage, at the age of 64 years.

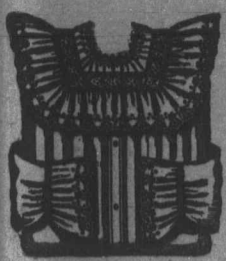
