Distressing Casualty.

Yesterday morning shortly after 5 o'clock, an alarm of fire was given from box 14, corner Brussels and Richmond streets. The fire proceeded from a row of tenement houses on the south side of Brussels street, and was discovered by Mr. John Gallant, who was saving the fire from the house owned by Michael Madigan, and occupied by several families. Before it was subdued, the four houses, two owned by Madigan, another by Patrick Cleary, and the third by Mrs. Mary Lynch, were almost completely destroyed, and to the loss of property was added the more terrible casualty of human life. An old man named Beatty, 60 or 70 years of age, was burned to death; his wife so badly injured from the flames that she is not expected to live, and the daughter in saving her mother, and the attempt made to save her father, was seriously injured. - St. John's News, 24th.

A Murderous Gorilla.

The visitors at Gibbs Zoological, yesterday, were favored with a combat between the gorilla and the Asiatic ape during the temporary absence of their keeper, the gorilla indulging in great strength and native ferocity mania, was forcibly thrown to the lecturers of M. du Challin and Ducello. The battle was brief, fierce and bloody. The superior agility of the ape gave him the advantage at first but the gorilla soon got home a blow that caused instant death. The arrival of the keeper stopped the conqueror's career in time to save the other apes in the same cage, and the guilty monster has been confined to a solitary confinement for life. This is the third animal that has been killed by this playful progenitor of Darwinian man. The slaughtered ape was valued at \$300, as it belonged to a species that is rarely imported to America. - The deceased will be stuffed.
