## School Trustees Agree With T. I. L.

All Subjects Referred to Them by T. I. L. are Desirable, but They do not Wish to Increase Assessment at Present

The Newcastle School Trustees, having considered the Town Improvement League's request that the Trustees make provision for the present year for Manual Training and Domestic Science in Harkins Academy and school gardening at Harkins Academy and Chaplin Island Road schools; for Medical Inspection of schools, voting at least sufficient enforcement of the Compulsory Attendance provisions of the school Law, reply as follows:

Dear Sir:

I beg to acknowledge receipt of yours of yesterday, enclosing copy of resolution passed by the Town Improvement League.

This was submitted to the Board of School Trustees at a meeting held last evening, and I am instructed by the Board to say:

The different subjects to which your resolution refers have already been considered by the Board a number of times, and the desirability of their adoption is admitted by all. This year, however, the Board is under the necessity of asking from the Town Council an increase of about \$1000 over last year's assessment to maintain the Town Schools as at present constituted.

Under the circumstances, and under general conditions as they are at present, the Board does not consider it opportune or advisable to further increase the School Assessment for the purpose of introducing innovations.

## Mr. James Robinson on Lumber Situation

Interviewed by Fredericton Clearer Says Cut Will be Much Smaller

The lumber cut on the Miramichi will run far short of the normal this year, according to James Robinson, of Millerton, who is in the city today. While the cut last year was around 70,000,000 feet the amount this year may not total 50,000,000 feet. The shortage this year is due to several causes, the principal being that owing to the large amount of lumber on hand from last year, for which shipping facilities could not be provided, the intention of the operators was to curtail this year's cut considerably. Then again, shortage of labor, late starting and depth of snow in the woods, all contributed to make the cut very much below the normal. According to Mr. Robinson, these conditions apply to lumber operations all over Eastern Canada and Maine.

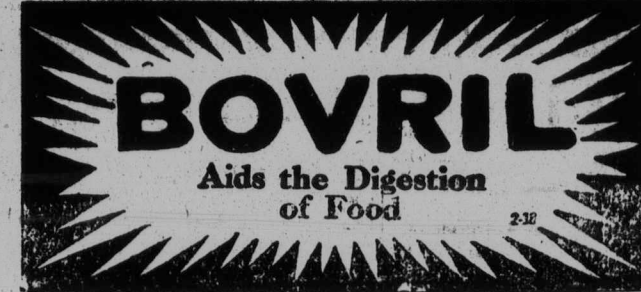
