By the old arrangements the New Brunswick Government set 40 per cent of the gross receipts and the Federal Govrnment 60 per cent, the former Government having builhe road and the latter oper ting it. It is stated by those in the east that at the presen ime the two Government are losing about $\$ 250,000$ each annually in the maintenanc of the St, John Valley Rail ways.
