At 3 o'clock on Tuesday, Vice-Admiral Taravelli signalled to the battleships, Guiseppi Garibaldi and Francesco Ferruces, that the bomardment was about to begin. These ssels with the flagship steamed up within two kilometres, i.e., about a le and a third, of the town. irst shells were directed at the Gov ernor's Palace and were well placed nmediately the Paleca and Amelia Sultona forts replied with a number of shots from 15 centimetre guns.
