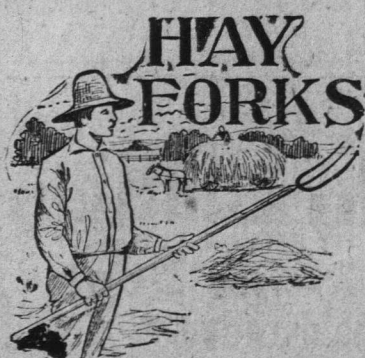

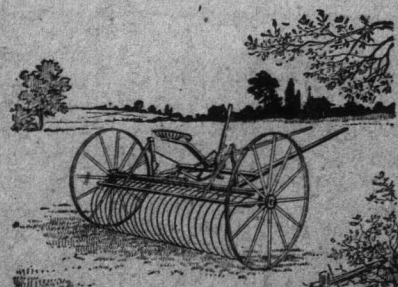

THE STEPHANO.—No word of the Stephano reaching Halifax has yet been received. She did not leave the wrecked steamer Matatua until Sunday morning last.

OVERHAULING THE FIFE.—Ship carpenters and painters are now busy overhauling and fitting out the yacht Fife at the Dry Dock wharf. She will soon be in readiness for her owners.

CATHEDRAL S. S. PICNIC.—The Cathedral Sunday School Picnic takes place to-morrow at Hafe's Farm, Freshwater Road. Teas will be served by the Women's Home Mission Association to visitors.

LEAVING FOR THE WRECK.—Diver Butler, with full equipment, leaves on the Trepassey train at 5 p.m. to-day for Holyrood, St. Mary's, where he will go down and make an examination of the ill-fated steamer Matatua.

A TOTAL WRECK.—There seems to be no doubt that the s.s. Matatua, the lumber laden liner, ashore at Peter's River, will be a total wreck, as she is now breaking up on the rocks, caused by a heavy sea. A portion of her cargo has been salvaged.

DOING WELL.—Mrs. John Mercer, 48 Spencer Street, has received the following cable from her son, Sergt. F. Mercer, who was wounded in the recent fighting, and is now in hospital in London: "Wound healing. Now convalescent. Am all right."

TO CUT OUT HEAD LIGHTS.—We understand the Municipal Council will be approached to pass an act prohibiting the use of head lights on motor cars while driving through the city, similar to the rule adopted in the chief cities in Canada.

STILL DETAINED.—The S.S. Kite which was ready to sail for Baffin's Land, has not yet got away. A new trouble has arisen between the crew and owner to the effect that the former want a guarantee as regards payment up to a certain time in case of the loss of the vessel.

DOG FISH CARRY AWAY TRAP.—Mr. Wm. Purcell, of Portugal Cove, met with a heavy loss this morning, when his codtrap was torn to pieces and partly carried away by an exceptionally large number of dog fish. The unwelcome visitors are causing a lot of anxiety among fishermen all along the south and east coast of Conception Bay.

TO-MORROW'S RACES.—The pony races at Mount Cashel Garden Party to-morrow promise to furnish a splendid attraction. Last evening some fifteen ponies were practising on the course, and a closely contested series of races is assured. A novel feature this year will be the division into two classes of ponies, affording the smaller ones a competition in their own class.
