Many Deaths in the Tribe Cause a Relapse to Superstition .

Lawton, Ok., May 21.-The Apache risoners of war on the Fort Sill reservation, many of whom professed the Christian religion, are going back to paganism. The unexpected death of old Chief Geronimo last year and the

many deaths since that time in the fast declining tribe have brought a renewsl of the old faith and ancient customs among the tribe. Other forms of worship will be taken up and a sort of pagan "revival" is expected. The




