COAL SHORTAGE IN EAST THIS WINTER

New York Dealers Say It Is Due to Recent Suspension of Work.

[Canadian Press.]
New York, Aug. 27.—Officers of the New York Coal Merchants' Association are agreed that there will be a serious shortage of coal throughout the east this winter, no matter how much is mined during the next two months. The suspension of mining in April and May, it is declared, will mean even under the most favorable circumstances a supply of one-tenth less than normal this winter.
Independent operators, who are not bound by the schedule prices of the coaly carrying companies, have begun to sell anthracite at a premium of 25 cents a ton and upward. The officers of the Coal Merchants' Association insist, however, that there is no necessity of people being alarmed because the anthracite will be distributed in such a way that there will be no serious distress.

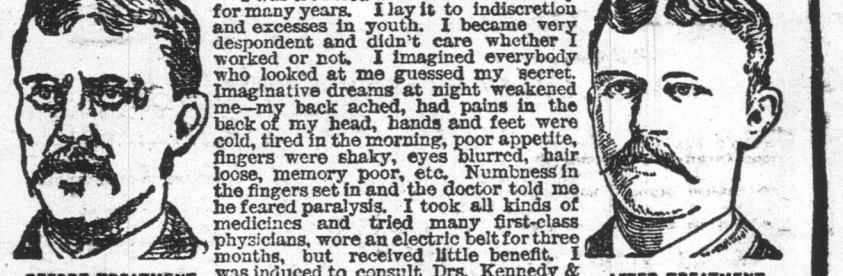
