CONSIDER APPOINTMENT OF SANITARY ENGINEER

Board of Education Will Discuss Advisability of Creating New Office.

The board of education will this afternoon consider the appointment of a heating and sanitary engineer. The building committee informally discussed the proposal yesterday and listened to an explanation from Harris Elliott, applicant, of the duties of such an official.

The board recently appointed Watt and Blackwell as school architects, at a retainer of \$2,000 per year, with a commission of three per cent on all construction work over \$50,000, but with the suggestion from them that the trustees also engage an expert engineer to pass on heating and ventilating plans.

Propose Commission. The proposal is to pay such an engineer a commission, say, of two per cent on all heating and ventilating construction, the engineer to be engaged on a consulting basis. Mr. Elliott and H. H. Angus, of Toronto, have applied for the position.

The board today will also consider the appointment of a permanent plumber and tinsmith. William Pope, of Stratford, was given the contract for wrecking the old Aberdeen School, his figure, \$1,600, being the lowest. There were eight tenders. The work is to be completed by June 1.

The committee recommended that John Hayman & Sons Limited, be paid \$14,445, the balance due on the Aberdeen School contract. The work has been approved by the architects. A total contractor's bill of \$11,161.40 for the addition to Talbot Street School, and a bill from A. E. Nutter, architect, for fees on the work, amounting, at the rate of 7 1/2 per cent, to \$837.10, were also recommended to be paid.

FABRE ORDERED TO RESIGN. Paris, April 7.—A morning paper understands that the minister of justice has requested the public prosecutor, Victor Fabre, to send in his resignation, and adds that in the event of his refusal he will be retained. M. Fabre is entitled to a pension of \$1,200.
