The meeting took exception to statement which according to one of the members of the deputation from of education who addressed a mass meeting of labor men last week was made at the last meeting of the city council, that the electors who opposed the industrial site bylaw would also oppose the technical school proposition. This assertion was branded as absolutely

According to the resolution the workers believe the school is absolutely necessary, and that the rising generation is entitled to every eduational advantage which can be afforded them.

Embodied in the resolution is a clause calling upon the board of education to employ only labor from the city on the erection of the

The trades council passed a secresolution favoring the abolition of the zoo. This resolution was deemed unnecessary, because certain members of the city council apparently favored keeping the animals despite the verdict rendered by the people on Jan. 1.

The delegates believe that if the zoo is kept the authorities will force the city to make considerable expenditure on improvements to the duarters occupied by the animals. The money could be spent to better advantage, it was thought.
