**URGE ERECTION OF  
TECHNICAL SCHOOL**

St. Thomas Trades and Labor Coun-  
cil Passes Resolution Favor-  
ing Immediate Move.

**WANT ZOO ABOLISHED**

Delegates Believe Authorities Will  
Force City To Improve Quarters  
If Animals Are Kept.

ST. THOMAS, March 3.—Members  
of the trades and labor council of  
this city strongly favor a vocational  
and technical school for this city. At  
the last meeting of the organization  
the delegates unanimously supported  
a resolution favoring the erection of  
such a school in this city in the near  
future.

The meeting took exception to a  
statement which according to one of  
the members of the deputation from  
the board of education who ad-  
dressed a mass meeting of labor  
men last week was made at the last  
meeting of the city council, that the  
electors who opposed the industrial  
site bylaw would also oppose the  
technical school proposition. This  
assertion was branded as absolutely  
unfair.

According to the resolution the  
workers believe the school is abso-  
lutely necessary, and that the rising  
generation is entitled to every edu-  
cational advantage which can be af-  
forded them.

Embodied in the resolution is a  
clause calling upon the board of edu-  
cation to employ only labor from  
the city on the erection of the  
school.  
The trades council passed a sec-  
ond resolution favoring the aboli-  
tion of the zoo. This resolution was  
deemed unnecessary, because cer-  
tain members of the city council ap-  
parently favored keeping the animals  
despite the verdict rendered by the  
people on Jan. 1.

The delegates believe that if the  
zoo is kept the authorities will force  
the city to make considerable ex-  
penditure on improvements to the  
quarters occupied by the animals.  
The money could be spent to better  
advantage, it was thought.

**THREE SERIOUSLY HURT  
AS TRAIN SOMERSAULTS**

Saskatoon Exhibition Car Runs Off  
Bridge With 20 Passengers  
Aboard.

SASKATOON, Sask., March 3.—An  
exhibition line street car left the  
tracks at the foot of the long hill on  
the Nutana side of the Saskatchewan  
River at 1 o'clock today, ran off the  
bridge with 20 passengers, turned a  
complete somersault and landed on  
the bank 30 feet below.

Three of the passengers were seri-  
ously injured, the others escaping  
with bruises.  
The car collapsed completely as it  
struck, but the momentum of the fall  
carried the heavy trucks over the  
heads of the passengers. Most of the  
passengers were able to clamber up  
the bank without assistance.

"My brakes would not hold," is the  
motorman's explanation. "She got  
away on me."

**2 SHOT BECAUSE  
LOOT TOO SMALL**

CHICAGO, March 3.—Incensed be-  
cause their loot was smaller than  
they had expected, two colored men,  
who robbed a real estate office today,  
shot down a 19-year-old girl sten-  
ographer and a clerk in the office.

The clerk, Frank Kleiner, cannot  
live, according to physicians.  
The condition of the girl, Marion  
Karlson, is serious.

**SCOTS GUARDS COMING.**  
CHATHAM, March 3.—Advice was  
received in the city today that the  
regimental band of His Majesty's  
Scots Guards, together with regim-  
ental pipers and dancers, will visit  
this city about the middle of May.  
The band is coming to the city under  
the auspices of the Great War Vet-  
erans of Canada, Dominion Com-  
mand, who are sponsoring the trip.

TO REMAIN AS  
BRITISH HEAD**

Unionist Ministers Seek To  
Heal Schism in Lloyd  
George Government.

**DIE-HARDS UNREPENTANT**

Younger Still in Saddle as  
Leader of Conservative  
Party.

LONDON, March 3.—Premier Lloyd  
George's threat to resign has been  
suspended at the urgent solicitation  
of his Unionist colleagues in the  
cabinet, according to an authoritative  
statement tonight, but no justification  
for its withdrawal is said to exist as yet.

Official denial is made that any  
exact time limit has been fixed for  
receiving assurances of loyalty to the  
premier from the adherents of Sir  
George Younger, the Unionist leader,  
although it is added that obviously  
the tension cannot be extended in-  
definitely.

Meanwhile there is no indication of  
any move on the part of the Unionist  
party to dethrone Younger as its  
leader. The general opinion is that  
the only happening will be that the  
Unionist ministers in the cabinet—  
Arthur J. Balfour and Austen Cham-  
berlain—may publicly reprove  
Younger for his tactics, as Lord Bir-  
kenhead has already done.

Speaking at Oxford today, Austen  
Chamberlain announced that the  
Unionist ministers had unanimously

**Building Material Men  
Lose Lien Law Fight.**

TORONTO, March 3.—The  
attempt of the supply  
houses and building material  
men to secure legislation in On-  
tario along the lines of the  
Mechanics' and Wage-Earners'  
Lien Act of Ohio, has met with  
failure. The special commit-  
tee of the Legislature appointed  
to report on the bill, submitted  
their finding to the house  
today. They express the opin-  
ion that the present Ontario  
act, with some amendments,  
should meet the situation.

requested the premier to continue as  
head of the government.

"Die-Hards" Unrepentant.  
Not the slightest repentance has  
yet been shown by the "die-hard"  
Conservatives, whose opposition to  
the leadership of the prime minister  
is primarily responsible for the pres-  
ent crisis. They are co-operating  
with the Ulsterites in the House  
of Commons in putting up a stiff fight  
against the Free State bill by pre-  
sented amendment after amendment.

The government has next Thursday  
scheduled for the reading of the  
measure, and owing to this deter-  
mined opposition the government will  
on Monday propose suspension of the  
rule whereby debate terminates at  
11 p.m. in order to get the committee  
stage finished before the night sitting  
ends.

In addition to this manifestation of  
restiveness in the Commons, it is  
said that the Unionist leaders are re-  
ceiving from all over the country  
communications promising loyal ad-  
herence to the Unionist party, but  
declining to extend that adherence  
to the coalition. This is really approval  
of the position assumed by Sir George  
Younger, and the present indications  
are that the party will refuse to de-  
pose its leader.

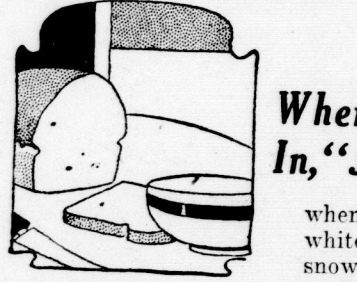

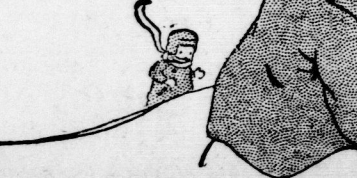

secretary of state for war, in a speech  
at Colchester tonight, revealed that  
the premier lately offered to retire  
from the government and support it  
in carrying out its unfinished pro-  
gram, but all the Conservative mem-  
bers of the government assured him  
of their support and begged that he  
continue.

In the endless speculation about the  
crisis there is much insistence on the  
view that Mr. Lloyd George has ar-  
rived at a point in his political career  
where he must define whether his lib-  
eralism or Conservatism. Since he be-  
came leader of the coalition under the  
abnormal circumstances of war, re-  
quiring a national, not party, policy,  
his political coloring has been in  
abeyance. If the coalition now dis-  
appears, it is argued, he must elect  
to attach himself to one party or the  
other.

According to some beliefs, his pre-  
sent action is a bid for leadership of  
the Unionist party, and that this  
falls there are two alternatives be-  
fore him—first, to form a new Cen-  
trist party, and second, to try to go  
back to the leadership of the Liberal  
of Liberal-Labor party.
