



The receipts of grain at the market to-day were considerably lower than Saturday, there only being 200 bushels of wheat, 100 bushels of barley and 50 bushels of peas offered. Fall wheat sold at \$127, spring wheat \$128, and wild goose at \$113. Barley brought \$2c to \$9c and peas \$5c. Hay and straw were unchanged.




