The State Turned Barkeeper. An interesting experiment in temperance legislation was inaugurated on July 1 in the State of South Carolina. That experiment is the absolute monopoly of the liquor traffic by the Government. About 60 per cent. of the people of the state are negroes, and more than 99 per cent. of the population are native-born Americans. The total population or the state three years ago was 1,151,140




