VENTILATION IN SCHOOLS.

As the old negro said: "De world do move," and the authorities are at last being awakened to the importance of the subject of ventilation of schools. Grown persons who have sat in a crowded church or public building for an hour or two, have come out with a tired feeling and a headache which marred their enjoyment of the matter in hand. The cause of it was that the building was poorly ventilated. In the majority of schools opening a window or a door is the only means of ventilation provided, whereas a certain quantity of the vitiated air should be withdrawn each minute and replaced by fresh air substituted from the outdoors. This is done by opening a door or lowering a window. How often pupils come home tired, dull and with their vitality lowered because of having been shut up in badly ventilated rooms. They are thus open to the attacks of disease and poorly equipped for mental and physical improvement. The regulation of buildings has been a neglected subject, though it does not require much consideration before its importance is acknowledged. It is the duty of the Medical Health Officers of the Province to take it up and intend to press for improvement all along the line. At the meeting in Brantford, the following resolution was passed: "That in view of the fact that in the various papers of the direct dangers from tuberculosis being present in schools and further from the accumulation of infected dust and dirt in schools, and the absence of sufficient ventilation, and the fact that health boards are systematically prosecuted by conventions of trustees, inspectors and teachers, and that a public health journal be published monthly, dealing carefully with the prevention, spread of, and care of contagious diseases, and further, that systematic attention should be carried out by inspectors specially fitted for the work, either by Government or by Health Officers duly appointed."

BY THE WAY.

THE KING'S CORONATION.

London, June 28 - A proclamation of King Edward VII, issued yesterday, announcing that the coronation is to take place on a day not yet determined upon, in June next, and that the coronation shall include only such as are traditionally sanctioned in Westminster Abbey. This officially excludes the King's Champion and numerous ancient usages in connection with the procession.

London, June 28 - After a prolonged debate and considerable discussion in the House of Commons, the committee, at 2 o'clock this morning, adopted the coal tax by a majority of 89.

LUSITANIA'S PASSENGERS.

How They Are Being Conveyed By Rail and Vessel to Their Destinations. Vessel Breaking Up. St. John's, Nfld., June 28 - The first trailer of the passengers of the Lusitania, the steamer of the British Steam Navigation Company which was wrecked near Cape Ballard early Wednesday morning, started yesterday morning for the country. The remainder of the passengers will follow by another train. Many of the children among the emigrants were without any clothing. The Lusitania is gradually breaking up.

BANK CLOSED ITS DOORS.

One of the Oldest New York Financial Institutions is a Squeezed. New York, June 28 - William Norton Cromwell, attorney for the Savings National Bank, has advised the bank to suspend payment. The statement given out is as follows: "The Savings National Bank was originally the Old Seventh Ward Bank, and was established in 1833. It was a member of the American Banking Association and the New York State Bankers' Association. Resources Over \$5,000,000. Saskatoon, June 28 - Government Telegrams: Harrison, reported missing, was found by a search party at Hunter's farm, 11 miles from here. On Tuesday, 18th inst. when about 38 miles from here the horse kicked the backboard to pieces, pitching Harrison out, where he lay in a stunned condition and too weak to move for three days. Then for four days more he wandered over the prairie, having no food all that time, but yesterday morning he reached Hunter's farm in an exhausted condition, on Wednesday morning at 1 o'clock. He was exposed to rains and dews and without food for over seven days. He is very weak, but has no injuries except a sprained shoulder and a bruise on his head. He is recovering himself in a couple of days.

Another Peterboro Boy Lost.

Peterboro, June 28 - Wilfred Trew, the 11-year-old son of Solomon Trew, and a number of other lads were in the Ouchew river yesterday afternoon bathing. The water here is shallow for a short distance out, until it declines speedily towards the mouth of the river. Wilfred Trew had reached a stump at the extreme edge of the shoal, and the boys who were with him state he jumped off, and was carried away by the current. He was seen by one of the boys, who was caught in the swift current and carried out into the river, never being of no avail. He was in the water 25 minutes before rescued, and his life was another at Weston.

Weston, Ont., June 28 - Another drowning fatality happened here last evening, the victim being Edward Hard, aged 21, son of James Hard, of Weston, Ont. He was seen by one of the boys, who was caught in the swift current and carried out into the river, never being of no avail. He was in the water 25 minutes before rescued, and his life was another at Weston.

Teacher Drowned.

Renfrew, June 28 - J. G. Moulton drove his team into the river to water them yesterday, but they went beyond their depth, and carried him down the bank and into the water. His body was recovered about an hour afterwards half a mile down the river. His mother and brother live in Almonte.

Old Lady Drowned.

Markdale, June 28 - Mrs. Duff, one of the oldest residents of Markdale, was found drowned in the district at her home. The deceased was subject to spells of faintness, and it is generally supposed that, while dipping clothes in the water, she fainted and fell in.

A Boy at Armpit.

Arnprior, June 28 - Wilbert Duncan, aged 7, son of Mr. James Duncan, of Arnprior, New York, was drowned yesterday morning in the Madawaska while playing on a boom stick.

Was the Woman a Candidate?

Utica, N. Y., June 28 - A woman about 25 years old came here from the West yesterday afternoon, and went to the Eagle Hotel, at Utica, Georgia, New York. She was assigned to a room, and did not again make her appearance. This afternoon it was found that she had committed suicide by taking laudanum. There is nothing whatever about her clothing to indicate her name or residence, and it is not known how long she has been in the country. She appeared very lady-like, and was evidently a woman of refinement.

Reports Less Gloomy.

Both in Loss of Life and Damage to Property First Reports Were Much Exaggerated. Charleston, W. Va., June 27 - Governor White yesterday issued the following: "To the Public - Advice received from personal representatives sent to the flat top region, are to the effect that the loss of life will not exceed fifty, and that there is no distress that cannot be provided for by the home people, and no need of outside help. The officers of help from all over the country have been generous and highly appreciated. If it should develop that aid from the outside is needed, I will take occasion to inform the people of West Virginia of that fact. In any event, I feel sure that the citizens of this state will be willing and able to supply any aid that may be needed. (Signed), A. R. White, Governor."

Deaths Are Over 100.

Williamson, W. Va., June 27 - Estimates of the loss of life by the flood have been raised again, and last night were placed at more than 100. Parties reached here last evening from the upper end of the flood, reporting the first authentic information, bringing the first authentic information.

Another Deluge in Virginia.

Bluedale, Va., June 27 - No bodily harm has been recovered to-day. The number of the largest heaps of drift were set on fire last night by some unknown friend of the public. It is estimated there were at least 25 dead bodies. The heap is now a pile of smouldering ashes.

Richard Rucker, also of Homestead, was frightfully injured by the electrical fluid, and will hardly recover. Rev. John Saulton and Clay F. Langs were badly shocked, but will recover.

STEEL RAILS FROM ANTWERP.

Grand Trunk Railway of Canada is importing 2,400 tons of steel rails from Antwerp. The contracts for the penitentiary supplies for all the penitentiaries of the Dominion have been awarded. Fred Lee Hoke, bank burglar and alleged murderer of County Constable Boyd, is now safely behind the bars at Kingston penitentiary, where he was sentenced by Judge McLaughlin for a term of 21 years, for the part he played in the robbery at Aurora for a term of 1900. He was removed from Toronto jail Wednesday by four sheriff's officers.
