

COURSE OF INSTRUCTION.

Preparatory Department.

Reading; Writing; Mental and Practical Arithmetic; Spelling; English History; Geography; Elements of Grammar; Class Singing; Theory of Music; Poetry; Mythology.—*French.*

Academic Department.

FIRST GRADE.—Reading; Poetry; Writing; Arithmetic; Spelling; Grammar and Composition; Geography; English, Canadian and American History; Grecian History; Natural Philosophy; Needlework; Domestic Economy; Class Singing; Theory of Music.—*French.*

SECOND GRADE.—Reading; Poetry; Writing; Arithmetic; Spelling; Grammar; Composition; Physical and Political Geography; English and American History; Roman History; Natural Philosophy; Needlework; Domestic Economy; Class Singing; Anatomy and Physiology; Botany; Theory of Music.—*French.*

Collegiate Department.

JUNIOR CLASS.—Reading and Poetry; Writing; Spelling; English Grammar and Logical Analysis; Etymology and Synonyms; Physical and Modern Geography; Universal History; English and American Literature; Chemistry; Arithmetic and Algebra; Botany; Composition; Rhetoric; Needlework and Domestic Economy; Class Singing; Theory of Music.—*French.*

SENIOR CLASS.—Reading and Poetry; Writing; Spelling; Rhetoric; Physical and Modern Geography; Universal History; Universal Literature; Readings and Recitations; Moral Philosophy; Arithmetic; Mathematics and Geometry; Physiology; Geology; Astronomy; Needlework and Domestic Economy; Class Singing; Theory of Music.—*French.*

Languages: ANCIENT—Latin and Greek. MODERN—French, German and Italian.

Drawing: From Models, including the Principles of Perspective, upon the modern plan adopted in European schools.

Painting: In Water Colors and Oil. Ornamental Free Hand Drawing.

Music: Vocal and Instrumental.

Calisthenics.

It will be observed that many of the subjects go through the whole Collegiate course. These are graded by Text Books, to suit the developing powers of the Pupil.

Lectures: In addition to the familiar Lectures given by the Teachers in connection with the Text Books used, the Principal and Lady Superintendent deliver Lectures to the young Ladies of the Senior Class on subjects of interest connected with their advanced studies.

The payments for Board and Tuition, which are proportioned between *Three Terms*, must be made *STRICTLY IN ADVANCE* at the commencement of each Term, viz.: 15th of September, 1st of December, 1st of April.

To secure admission a payment of \$20 must be made on application, which will be accounted for when the pupil leaves the College.

PARLOR BOARDERS.
