It treats the subject under four heads; by  
Calvinism as a Political Force; Calvinism  
as a Political Force in the History of the  
United States; Calvinism as a Moral Force  
and, Calvinism as an Evangelizing Force.  
The discussion as the name of the book  
implies is historical rather than argu-  
mentative. The writer shews not so  
much what Calvinism is, nor what it can  
do as what it has done. "By their fruits  
ye shall know them," and the author sets  
forth in fair array the fruit that has been  
borne by this goodly tree.

THE CHILDREN'S SERMON by John C.

of the book is devoted to the sermon and

In the latter part of the book the writ-  
er gives fifteen sermonettes printed just  
as they were written and delivered.
