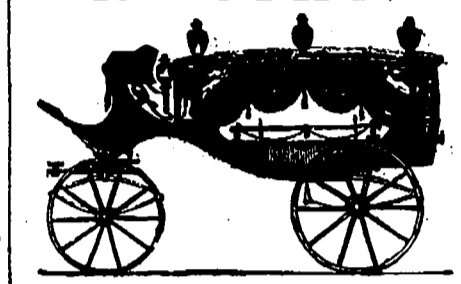

DOMINION LANDS.

DEPARTMENT OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE, OTTAWA. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that in pursuance of the provisions of the Act 35 Victoria, cap. 23, intitled "An Act respecting the Public Lands of the Dominion," His Excellency the Governor General in Council, has been pleased to approve of the following regulations relating to the cutting of timber for building purposes or fuel, in the Province of Manitoba.

To settlers on Prairie Lands, who have no wood lot permits, may be granted the right to cut, free of charge a reasonable supply of timber and fuel for their own use. Special permits to cut for market, will be granted to parties at the following rates: Oak Timber, 2 cents per foot, linear measure, Poplar " 1 cent " " Fuel " 25 cents per cord.
