### PRAYERS

Mr. Pringle for Mr. Weatherhead, from the Standing Committee on Labour, Manpower and Immigration, presented the Second Report of the said Committee, which is as follows:

Pursuant to its Order of Reference of Wednesday, February 17, 1971, your Committee has considered the following votes listed in the Estimates 1971-72.

- Vote 1 relating to the Department of Labour;
  - Votes 1, 5, 10, 15 and 20 relating to the Department of Manpower and Immigration;
  - Vote 5 relating to the Unemployment Insurance Commission; and
  - Vote 25 relating to the Immigration Appeal Board.
- Your Committee commends them to the House.

A copy of the relevant Minutes of Proceedings and Evidence (*Issues Nos. 10 to 14 inclusive*) is tabled.

Mr. Greene, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid upon the Table,—Copies of Bulletin entitled "Corporate Disclosure Requirements as they Pertain to Mining Companies"—November, 1970.—Sessional Paper No. 283-7/28.

Mr. Lang, seconded by Mr. Greene, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-239, An Act to amend the Prairie Grain Advance Payments Act, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The text of the Message and recommendation of the Governor General printed pursuant to Standing Order 62(2) in relation to the foregoing Bill is as follows:

His Excellency the Governor General recommends to the House of Commons a measure to amend the Prairie Grain Advance Payments Act; to provide for the Governor in Council to prescribe the rate per bushel in respect of advance payments; to establish on a continuing basis provisions in respect of emergency advance payments for drying grain and to provide for emergency advance payments for unthreshed grain to a producer to a maximum of three thousand dollars; to extend the
