Mr. J.-Roland Comtois (Terrebonne): Mr. Speaker, I listened rather attentively to most of the speeches made tonight. To conclude, I think there is an urgency to revise the rules of this House. I am perhaps repeating what some said, I think the point was made, the problems were pointed out, and in the future those who sit on that committee should perhaps agree in an emergency debate on limiting the participation of the different parties represented in this House to a few members only. In this way, the same purpose would be met in a much shorter period of time. I know there are other members on the government side who have not spoken; just like me, they listened and could easily intervene at this point, but I think that out of decency this debate should be brought to an end at this point. I want to point out once again before I sit down

that I think the rules are being abused when debates are prolonged in this fashion and that those same rules should be amended as soon as possible.

Mr. Deputy Speaker: Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 26 (13) I am convinced, and definitively, that this debate is over.
