measures, while they are here equally upbraided by France for pursuing these—This it is to be ministers of Britain in affairs with France !

III. After what has been faid, there is no occasion to infift upon the negotiations, and evalions of them by our ministry, alledged by the court of France, in the fequel of this their memorial. They had brought the court of Britain into a long and tedious negotiation of feven years about those disputes in America, till they had feized all the countries in difpute, even in the course of the negotiation ; and now they wanted to draw them into another like negotiation, till they could fecure themfelves in those places they had feized, or be better prepared for doing it; which was plainly the fcope and drift of all their negotiations. For this reason, when our ministry came to the point with them, and the only point in dispute, to fettle the limits between the two nations in America, and make them evacuate the territories they had fo unlawfully feized, 'altho' they would have given up part of the undoubted rights of Britain for the fake of peace, yet all the answer they could get from France, by their own confession, was an absolute refufal of the just propofals of Britain; Cette response etoit un refus absolu d'y fouscrire, page 42.
