THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL I⁸.

An Act for the relief of Hazel Victoria Watt-Hewson.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Hazel Victoria Watt-Hewson, residing at the city of Toronto, in the province of Ontario, saleswoman, wife of Arthur Francis Watt-Hewson, marine engineer, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Vancouver, in the province of British Columbia, has 5 by her petition alleged that they were married on the nineteenth day of October, A.D. 1922, at the said city of Toronto, she then being Hazel Victoria McCuaig, a spinster: and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, because of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; 10 and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:-15

Marriage dissolved.

Right to marry again. dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.
2. The said Hazel Victoria McCuaig may at any time 20 hereafter marry any man whom she might lawfully marry

1. The said marriage between Hazel Victoria McCuaig

and Arthur Francis Watt-Hewson, her husband, is hereby

hereafter marry any man whom she might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Arthur Francis Watt-Hewson had not been solemnized.
