Canadian cabbage, which was very scarce for a few days, is again coming in in large quantities, selling at 65c to 75c per bushel basket. D. Spence had some choice strawberries from Thomas Thorley and Wm. Bourne of Clarkson. Dawson Elliott had some choice ones from E. A. Orr, Clarkson. H. Peters had a shipment of first-class Canadian cabbage from Grant and East-man of Blenheim. Cherries remained a slow sale at 50c to 60c per 11-quart basket for the sour varlety. Wholesale Fruits.
