the Twenty-fifth day of March, and on the Twentyminth day of September in each year, or within fourteen days at furthest next after such of those days respectively, to pay over to the receiver general of taxes of and for the county, riding, or district in which such parish may be situate, the full amount of such rates by two equal payments, and so on from year to year until the whole of the sum by His Majesty, or by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury contracted to be advanced in the execution of any such contracts as aforesaid, or such smaller sum as shall have been actually advanced, shall have been repaid with interest, at the rate of four pounds per centum per annum.

And be it further Enacted, That every per-All Emigrants son who, by virtue of any such contract as aforesaid, so removed to shall be disembarked in any of His Majesty's posses- tlements, and sions abroad, shall thenceforth lose his or her settle-chial relief. ment in the parish from which he or she shall be so removed, and in any other parish in England or Wales, and shall have no further claim or title in the law to relief from the rates of any parish in England or Wales.

XIII. And be it further Enacted, That this Act may be altered, varied, or repealed, by any Act or Acts to be passed in this present session of Parliament.

XIV. And be it further Enacted, That the several powers and authorities hereby vested in the said Commissioners, and in the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury respectively, shall continue vested in them for five years, and from thence until the end of the then next session of Parliament, and no longer.
