


BROCKVILLE, Nov. 7.-(Special.)-The Conservatives of Brockville rid-ing, at a largely attended convention this afternoon, unanimously selected the sitting member, A. E. Donovan, to again contest the seat for the pro-vincial legislature. Mr. Donovan made a capital address, reviewing the record of the Whitney government and outlined legislation planned for the future. In a resolution of confidence in Sir

In a resolution of confidence in Sir James Whitney the convention sug-gested that the government consider seriously the important problem of tax-reform, with a view of relieving in some measure the weight of taxation upon buildings and improvements, and shifting it in part to the land, as it is felt that the burden of taxation is at present unequally divided, and exer-clases a retarding influence upon pro-gress and enterprise. The convention, in another resolu-tion, urged upon the municipalities of eastern Ontario and upon the hydro-electric commission the importance of co-operation for the purpose of secur-ing an abundant supply of cheap elec-tric power in this section of the pro-vince. 
The government was also urged to co-operate with the Dominion Govern-ment in any scheme that may be pro-posed for the improvement of high-ways.


