READINESS AT OTTAWA. Customs Encylopedia in Five Handy Volumes Issued for Use of Customs

Officers and Importers - Seizure o French Kid Gloves at Montreal for

Undervaluation-Other Notes, OTTAWA, Jan. 15.—Since the Hon. Clarke Wallace has had control of the Customs fre has devoted a great deal of his energy to revising five very valuable compilations, made under the supervision of Mr. Thomas J. Watters, Acting Commissioner of Customs, and which when completed will form a compact and convenient encyclopedia of customs literature, comprising almost everything which any Customs officer or person having business with the Customs can desire to know about Customs law, tariff and practice. These publications are of uniform size, not bulky, and contain a vast amount of information. They all bear date July 1 last, and have been issued as fast as they could be completed. The Queen's Printer deserves credit not only for the speed with which they have been turned out, but for their excellent typographical appearance. The first three volumes contain, first, all orders in council relating to customs from July, 1888, to June 30, 1893; second, an analytical index to the customs tariff as in force July 1, 1893; third, an index to circular memoranda. The fourth volume was issued to-day and consists of 230 pages of a compilation of statutes of the Dominion of Canada relating in whole or in part to the assignment of duties to officers of customs. "This volume has been issued," says Mr. Watters in his introduction, "in order that collectors and other officers of customs may have in convenient form those portions of the various statutes, apart from the Customs or Tariff Act, which relate especially to the performance of any duty by such offenders or which affect is any direct way their interests and positions."

These publications should prove to customs officers and importers that the criminal code and revised statutes were intended to prove to revised statutes were intended to prove to judges and lawyers that it is the embodiment of all the law. When a customs officer has carefully studied these publications he ought to thoroughly understand what the customs laws and regulations are and what his own duties and responsibilities are in connection with the administration of those laws and regulations. Importers and others having business with the customs will also find that it will save them time, money and annoyance to get these publications and and annoyance to get these publications and study them carefully.

What may turn out to be a very important seizure was made in Montreal on Saturday, although the goods actually seized so far only amount to one case of kid gloves imported by the Montreal agent of Perrin & Co., the great glove manufacturers of Grenoble, France. The importation of Perrin's gloves has very largely increased of late years and the fact that these goods were being sold cheaper than those of other manufacturers led to the suspicion that there might be something wrong about the importation. An examination of a case of gloves at Montreal on Saturday showed that there was something very wrong with them, as the goods in the case did not correspond at all with the invoice, being considerably undervalued, and they were accordingly seized.
