

C. P. R. WON'T RECEDE. If Mayor Shaw Wants the Company's Property the City Must Pay a Rental.

The conference yesterday between Superintendent Tait of the C.P.R. and Mayor Shaw respecting the chain ferry was not encouraging to the Mayor. The C.P.R. will not recede one inch from their original position. If the city does not care to pay the \$1500 rental demanded it must do without the concessions which the Mayor is asking to enable the city to dock the ferry at the Queen's Wharf leasehold of the company. The company holds the lease tentatively as good shipping property, and would prefer not to have the city there at all. But rather than refuse absolutely they are making the impossible condition of an annual \$1500 rental for the use of their docks.
