Canadian Trade Good. The Weekly Review of Dun & Co.—Collections Ahead of Last Year.

[G. N. W. Special to The Advertiser.] Toronto, Ont., April 7.—R. G. Dun & Co.'s weekly review of trade in the Dominion says: Montreal reports indicate a satisfactory movement as a result of a fall in freight rates, but business in heavy lines of merchandise, and in some districts, such as lines as groceries, etc., are feeling the benefit, and sales are freer than a fortnight ago. The colder weather has somewhat affected city retail trade, but the wholesale warehouses show considerable business in the dispatch of merchandise, and still report receipt of good orders. Collections are ahead of last year at this time. General wholesale trade at Toronto has been fairly active during the week. The dry goods trade report good orders for autumn goods, while the grocery-up business in seasonal lines is fair. There is some improvement in groceries. Suggesting a recovery in general expected advance owing to increased opening of navigation is drawing near, and some increase in general movement is naturally expected. The all lines of merchandise, with the exception of 32 failures in Canada, as against 33 a year ago last week.
