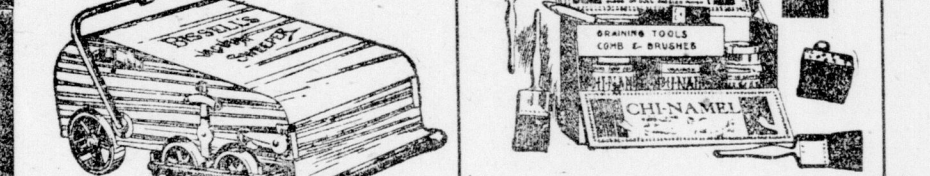

GODERICH MAN GETS \$310 IN DAMAGES

GODERICH, March 13.—At the spring assizes here, with Mr. Justice

Sutherland presiding, an action for damages for the sum of \$2,000 against Robert Clark, was brought by Thomas Glazier. He claimed that Mr. Clark's auto ran into the rear of his buggy and put it into the ditch; that the horse, taking fright, dragged the plaintiff for some distance along a barbed wire fence and caused some severe injuries. The road at the point of the accident was 11 feet from ditch to ditch, and the defendant claimed that his car was only going at the rate of seven miles per hour when he struck the rig. The jury brought in a verdict for \$310 damages.

The case of Wright vs. McLean, an action to set aside a will, was dismissed without costs, the costs of the defendant to be paid out of the estate.
