The balance in the Treasurer's hands at the end of 1865 is \$2064.24, whereof \$1327.50 is appropriated to support of missions, but not then called for, and \$80, being a grant to a parsonage, leaving \$656.74 to the credit of the year 1866.

EXTRACTS FROM THE MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

June 16, 1865.—\$80 was granted towards purchasing a parsonage at Port Medway.

A grant of \$100 was made to Shelburne toward the support of an assistant, on condition of \$400 being raised by the people.

It was announced that the Rev. G. W. McCawley, D. D., had been appointed Archdeacon of Nova Scotia, and ex officio first V. P. of the D. C. S.

October 20, 1865.—A grant of \$50 was made towards supplying missionary services at Londonderry Mines for one year.

\$100 was granted to the Rev. T. W. Morris toward enabling him to provide an assistant missionary in his parish.

Colonel Myers was appointed a member of the Investment Committee vice L. Hartshorne, Esq., deceased.
