BONFIRES AFTER THE WAR IS OVER

Worn-out Political Clothes Will Add To Fuel

"WE FIDDLED, THEY PREPARED"

Strong Address by C. A. Magrath Before Teronto Canadian Club on Conditions Which Will

(Toronto Mail and Empire)
"There will be bonfires after this war "There will be bonfires after this war is over. The fuel for some of the largest in Europe, in my opinion, will consist in Europe, in my opinion, will consist of old worn-out political clothes. We ave loved the heckler. With what deght we have listened to the verbal activation of his prey. Oh! we have been spert fiddlers and now we are strugling to quench the fire."

These words were spoken by C. A. lagrath, chairman of the Canadian section of the Joint International Waterays Commission at a Canadian Club incheon. They followed the remarks:

Now Is the Time "This then is no time for flowery tatements—no time for platitudes—no time for vain regrets, though God knows there is ample reason for our being distatisfied with ourselves—and no time for recriminations. It is a case of do or die so far as the British Empire is concerned. It is a case of a long pull and a strong pull by every unit in the Empire. Now is the time, today, not tomorrow, to throw our whole energy into this struggle.

Because Germany's trade was cut off the entire energy of the nation was divided into two classes: Men to fight, and men and women to supply them with requisites. Great Britain's war expenditure was now about a million dollars an hour. Canada's war expenditure by the end of December 31st, 1916, would be probably \$392,000,000.

"If we could get back, near the homelike methods of life of thirty years ago, the yearly earnings of Canada would before many years make her wealthy heyond any dreams of the present."


Mr. Magrath complimented the minister of finance on his banking arrangements; but he pointed out that this country's part in paying for the war was not to be measured by the population, for Great Britain was a creditor nation and Canada a debtor with interest to pay. He warned his hearers to be prepared for a tightening of the screw of taxation. To bear it Canada must be united. "When a man's fiesh and blood goes into the fight, friends, political and otherwise, do not count. This is no time for politics."


