AN URGENT APPEAL.

Mr. Noel Marshall, chairman of the Canadian Red Cross Society, appeals on behalf of the Society to all Canadians to contribute even more generously than in the past. The reason is obvious—Our Canadian soldiers are now in the thick of the fighting and will be there in steadily increasing numbers. The call for hospital supplies will be more urgent, and must be met. Mr. Marshall writes—

CLEAN UP THE CITY.

Every citizen should read carefully the directions given by Com. McLellan for the two clean-up days in this city next week. The campaign should be thorough, and all should co-operate. It is to be particularly noted that refuse must be placed in barrels and boxes, and that the authorities do not propose to haul away lumber and old junk and miscellaneous goods dumped on the sidewalk. Wood can be cut up and burned at home, and the junk man can look after the other articles for which the owner has no use. Ashes, garbage, old papers and anything that can be packed in barrels and boxes will be taken, although the commissioner gives special instructions as to the packing of the garbage.

A SPLENDID PATRIOTISM

Until the end of the war there will be only one party in the United Kingdom. This fact was made abundantly clear yesterday by Premier Asquith and Mr. Bonar Law. The prime minister intimated that there would be a reconstruction of the cabinet on broad personal and political lines, and that in the process no man would sacrifice one iota of his political convictions. Mr. Bonar Law said that the only purpose of such an arrangement would be to prosecute the war to a successful issue, the whole country being organized for that particular task.

FIELD COMFORTS

An organization whose sole aim will be to make public appeals and collect and send forward field comforts for the soldiers who are fighting has just been formed in this city. It will send the comforts through the agency of the National Service Committee of Canada, and the Canadian War Contingent Association whose headquarters are in London, through which everything for the soldiers who are in the field must go. The Red Cross handles everything for the sick and wounded. In some places the organizations handling Red Cross supplies are allowed to pass through their headquarters warehouse in Toronto and through the shipping warehouse, but it points out that the Red Cross cannot itself collect and send the goods forward. This must be done by an organization under another name, even though made up of the same persons. There is a constant appeal for tobacco; and such articles as socks, colored handkerchiefs, pipes, candies, gum, confectionery, games and sporting goods would also be a great boon to the men. The National Service Committee has already sent forward large quantities of these materials, but with more men in the trenches there will be still greater need of this loving service on the part of those at home. An appeal throughout New Brunswick will doubtless meet with a ready response.

TO INTERN DERNBERG IF THEY CATCH HIM

Kaiser's Representative Will Have Little Chance to Get Back to Germany

London, May 17—If Dr. Dernberg attempts to get back to Germany through English patrolled waters he runs a risk of being seized as a hostage of war. The news of Dr. Dernberg's anxiety to get back to the Fatherland has caused wonderment as to the motives that lead him to want to get out of America at this time. The opinion is that Dr. Dernberg feels that the propaganda spread by him in America has been found to be unsavory in view of the cumulative evidence of Germany's policy, which reached a climax in the sinking of the Lusitania, and that Dr. Dernberg finds himself hopelessly out of touch with real American sentiment.

However that may be, Great Britain would like to see Dr. Dernberg try to get home on any steamer touching British shores. If he is audacious enough to sail on a British steamer there naturally would be no escape for him. British authorities in that event would arrest him the moment he stepped on land. If he sailed on a Holland steamer, the British, if certain he was aboard, might stop the steamer and arrest him when the ship got into English waters.

What would happen to Dr. Dernberg after his seizure would probably be nothing less than imprisonment as an enemy alien, but England really does not think he will head this way. Officials are inclined to think that if he leaves Am-
