**A GALLANT ACT**

A few weeks ago Captain L. Popham, commanding the Leyland liner Philadelphia, brought to the notice of the Imperial Merchant Service Guild that a gallant action had been performed by his first officer, L. A. Rhodes, who went in response to signals of distress from a diamond schooner. The schooner was sighted off Trevoe Head in the English Channel at daybreak on March 18. At the time a northerly wind was blowing with a high cross sea, and to make matters more difficult the vessel was at times hidden from view in heavy squalls of sleet. Nevertheless with a volunteer crew, Mr. Rhodes put off from the Philadelphia on his errand of mercy. He had not gone far before the boat commenced to slip heavy water, and one of the seas which swept over the boat broke three of the oars and washed one away. Damage was also done to the boat, but she kept together. A quarter-master was injured through the breaking of the oars as he fell backwards and struck his head on one of the thwart, causing concussion of the brain. After being two hours in the boat the first officer found that owing to their predicament they could not reach the schooner, and they had to return to the Philadelphia. When the boat came alongside she was smashed to pieces and the exhausted crew were hauled up on board with lines.

The guild reported the case to the Liverpool Shipwreck and Humane Society, who in turn have now sent to the guild for their presentation to Mr. Rhodes the silver medal of the society and a framed certificate of thanks. In addition to this they have given monetary awards to the boat's crew. Mr. Rhodes has since been given a commission in the Royal Naval Reserve, and is now attached to one of His Majesty's ships.
